Any student coming in at the Advanced or **Proficient*** level will be able to understand, with ease, virtually everything heard or read. At this level, students can summarise information from different spoken and written sources, reconstructing arguments and accounts in a coherent and cohesive way. They can express themselves spontaneously, very fluently and precisely, differentiating finer shades of meaning even in more complex situations.
